The Bachelor of Early Childhood Education (Honours) is a homegrown programme specifically designed to deliver a suitable level of theoretical and practical understanding in the fields of early childhood education. Its first intake was in April 2019 and has achieved accreditation from the Malaysian Qualifications Agency (MQA) in early 2019.

This programme designed to make sure students can apply a coherent and detailed knowledge and understanding of the underlying values and principles of relevant curriculum early childhood education and utilize the skills. COURSE INFORMATION

ECC1013 PLAY IN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Prerequisite: None

This course helps students to understand the role of play and to acquire ability in using play as a method of learning for young children. The course also observes play theory, types of play and their relationship to age, organization of various play activities to encourage children's physical, intellectual, language, social and emotional development. Students are required to construct playthings guided by the principles taught.

ECC1023 SPIRITUAL AND MORAL IN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION.

Prerequisite: None

This course provides explanation and knowledge to the students on the importance of advocating good spiritual and moral values to children in both childcare centres / nurseries (TASKA) and Kindergarten / preschool (TADIKA) so they will grow up as a moral and charismatic generation. Students will also understand religious differences and unity and respect the diversity of ethnic beliefs in Malaysia.

ECD1033 GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE CHILDREN

Prerequisite: None

This course aims to provide knowledge to students on theories of development and factors affecting the learning process. This will cover topics such as the process of development, intelligence, individual differences and motivation.

ECC1043 INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNOLOGY FOR YOUNG CHILDREN

Prerequisite: None

This course discusses the evolution of technology in teaching, concepts and fundamental principles in the field of instructional technology. It also introduces current and future teachers to the approaches, methods, and procedures for integrating computers and other media into the curriculum using a systematic instructional design approach. In addition, the course will also focus on the latest issues affecting instructional technology until now.

ECM1053 LAW AND ADVOCACY IN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Prerequisite: None

This course provides an explanation and clarification of various acts and rights of children in childcare centres/ nurseries (TASKA) and kindergartens/ preschools

(TADIKA). This course also exposes them to the child care and early childhood education law. Students are also given an insight into the importance of registration, regulation and supervision of childcare centres and kindergartens in the context of Malaysia.

ECC1063 INTRODUCTION OF CURRICULUM IN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Prerequisite: None

Students will be guided in acquiring on curriculum approaches and quality pedagogies to design planning for young children (in TADIKA). The creative arts will be an approach investigated to collect information and analyse information related to children's learning and development.

ECC1073 ARTS AND CRAFTS FOR CHILDREN

Prerequisite: None

This course aims to provide exposure to students on basic principles of art for young children carried out in both childcare centres/ nurseries (TASKA) and kindergartens/ preschools (TADIKA). Furthermore, they will be trained to prepare activities and evaluation of children's art. Students are also given training to produce art works through various activities. They will also gain knowledge on the role of art activities in children's personal and artistic development through their art.

ECC1083 PARENT AND COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT IN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Prerequisite: None

This course is designed to emphasize on joint efforts between parents and child care centers to ensure optimum physical, emotional, spiritual and intellectual development in children. This development will be seen from the perspective of the background and the social context of parents and child care centers. Theories, programs and recent studies on the involvement of child care centers will be presented to relate the role of these two parties in the efforts to educate children in the early stages.

ECD2023 ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Prerequisite: None

This course is designed to observe the progress and development of the children through observation and the study of their information and work in both childcare centres/ nurseries (TASKA) and kindergartens/ preschools (TADIKA). It also looks into the drafting of follow-up actions to improve these children's potential.

ECC2033 BAHASA MELAYU DALAM PENDIDIKAN AWAL KANAK-KANAK

Prerequisite: None

Kursus ni memberi penerangan kepada pelajar untuk mendidik kanak-kanak mendengar dan menyatakan apa yang didengar, bertutur dengan sebutan yang betul dan bahasa yang bertatasusila, membaca dan menceritakan isi bacaan sesuai dengan peringkat perkembangan kanak-kanak serta menulis perkataan dan ayat mudah dengan betul.

ECC2043 LANGUAGE AND LITERACY IN EARLY CHILDHOOD

Prerequisite: None

The course exposes students to the theory and practice in developing language and communication skills of children in early childhood education in childcare centres/ nurseries (TASKA) and kindergartens/ preschools (TADIKA). The students will also be trained to select and use appropriate literary materials to teach language to the children. Approaches related to language skills must be mastered by the students so they can help the children to speak, communicate, read and write efficiently.

ECM2053 MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION OF EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION INSTITUTION

Prerequisite: None

This course will expose the students on the aspects of management and administration in the early childhood education plus various management models in both childcare centres/ nurseries (TASKA) and kindergartens/ preschools (TADIKA). In addition, students will also learn the physical management, institutional and human resources management. In this course, students will learn how to prepare a daily activity schedule and programs which involve parents. Students will also visit a number of childcare centres/ nurseries (TASKA) and kindergartens/ preschools (TADIKA) to obtain the experience and skills.

UCS3153 ARABIC FOR COMMUNICATION

Prerequisite: None

Arabic 2 is designed to help students improve their language skills and develop their ability to use it. This subject also will guide the students to strengthen the language in mastering the four language skills at the intermediate level.

UCS3163 FRENCH FOR COMMUNICATION

Prerequisite: None

This course is designed to focuses on exposure to, and practice of, general language functions in spoken, written and aural forms. Grammatical structures necessary for the production of the target language and practice of pronunciation, intonation and stress. It also helps to develop language-learning skills and to foster cultural (Francophone) awareness.

ECC2063 MATHEMATIC AND NUMERACY IN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION**Prerequisite: None**

This course includes an exploration of mathematics and numeracy designed for prospective early childhood teachers in both childcare centres/ nurseries (TASKA) and kindergartens/ preschools (TADIKA). Students will be able to apply all knowledge in cognitive development in the teaching of children's mathematics and numeracy. Students are also exposed to various methods and techniques as well as activities at early childhood educational institutions that stimulate the development of basic mathematical and numeracy skills.

ECD2073 PRINCIPLE OF CHILDREN BEHAVIOR MANAGEMENT**Prerequisite: None**

This course is designed to enhance students' knowledge on the theories and principles in managing children behaviour in both childcare centres / nurseries (TASKA) and kindergarten / preschool (TADIKA). The course promotes appropriate guidance and positive discipline for young children in which children can develop control and interact positively with others.

ECC2083 METHOD AND STRATEGIES OF TEACHING IN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION**Prerequisite: None**

The course is designed to expose students to teaching methods in early childhood education in childcare centres/nurseries (TASKA) and kindergartens/ preschools (TADIKA). Students will learn various teaching techniques, strategies and theories and the use of materials to assist effective teaching. The course provides the students to broaden their understanding of the emerging teaching methods and strategies in early childhood education.

ECC2093 APPRECIATION IN MUSIC FOR YOUNG CHILDREN**Prerequisite: None**

This course provides an understanding and the role of music in the cognitive, social, emotional, physical and moral development of the children. Using knowledge of music theory, singing, playing musical instruments and creative movement, participants can use music as an effective teaching and learning tool for children. Students will be exposed to a variety of theatre and stage techniques for children with the combination ideas from teachers/ caregivers and children.

ECC2103 SCIENCE FOR YOUNG CHILDREN**Prerequisite: None**

The course aims to provide an early exposure on science and the process of reasoning in early childhood education that should be applied to students following this course in order for them to apply it to their students. This course provides students with various aspects related to science and the environment that can be used to nurture and educate children in the early stages. Students will be given a deep understanding of relevant aspects of science and its processes.

ECC3013 SPECIAL NEEDS IN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Prerequisite: None

This course covers the methods in identifying gifted students in childcare centres/nurseries (TASKA) and kindergartens/ preschools (TADIK) and how to manage them in ensuring that they can develop their abilities better. It focuses on planning the right curriculum for these children and also promoting the development of their skills through the special curriculum plans and also collaboration with the parents.

MPU3333 PENGAJIAN MALAYSIA 3

Prerequisite: None

This course discusses the history and politics, the Constitution, the State Administration of System and Structure, and Social Solidarity, the National Development and Religion and Belief. This course is designed to produce graduates who understand the identity of Malaysia towards fostering the spirit of universality. Teaching and learning will be implemented in the form of lectures, assignments, exams and learning experience.

MPU3363 ETHICS AND MORAL 3

Prerequisite: None

Kursus ini membincangkan konsep asas, latar belakang dan realiti sosial masa kini hubungan etnik di Malaysia dari perspektif kesepaduan sosial. Tujuan kursus ini ialah memberikan kesedaran dan penghayatan dalam mengurus kepelbagaian ke arah pengukuhan negara bangsa. Pengajaran dan pembelajaran akan dilaksanakan dalam bentuk pembelajaran berasaskan pengalaman melalui aktiviti individu, berpasukan dan semangat kesukarelaan. Pada akhir kursus ini, pelajar diharapkan dapat mengamalkan nilai-nilai murni, mempunyai jati diri kebangsaan, dan menerima kepelbagaian sosio-budaya etnik di Malaysia.

ECC3023 SOCIOLOGY IN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Prerequisite: None

The course provides the basic concepts and application of sociology of education, and introduces students to the educational function. The focus of the course is in sociological aspects of the development of an individual, family and social structure. Current issues such as the relationship between the individuals, family, parenting, gender, ethnicity, educational opportunities and also the issue of unity are discussed. Historical development of the national education system and early childhood education in

childcare centres/ nurseries (TASKA) and kindergartens/ preschools (TADIKAs) are being emphasized to explain the association of educational institutions with social policy for children.

ECD3033 EDUCATORS OF EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Prerequisite: None

This course explores the common practices and professionalism that are central to the role of early childhood educators (at TASKA and TADIKAs level). The course discusses the characteristics of good early childhood educators, as well as the code of ethics that are important to educators in relation to children, families, community and profession.

ECD3043 INTRODUCTION TO RESEARCH METHODOLOGY IN EDUCATION

Prerequisite: None

The course provides students with the factors influencing research and basic research principles which enable them to examine education research report, utilise the research findings in the learning through the mini project assignment and to participate actively in Early Childhood Education research processes (at both TASKA and TADIKAs level).

ECC3063 TEACHING ENGLISH FOR YOUNG LEARNERS

Prerequisite: None

This course is designed to provide skills and knowledge useful to develop an effective lesson to deliver English lesson for young learners as well as finding the proper method to assess young learners. Aspects such as skills development, evaluation, and assessment are also been explored through media rich content, and opportunities for discussion with teachers around the world.

ECM3073 PROGRAMME PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

Prerequisite: None

This course addresses the latest trends affecting the childcare workforce (at TASKA and TADIKAs) and provides guidelines for recruiting, hiring, and retaining quality personnel which include job descriptions and hiring practices. The content of the course explores all aspects of administration including the role of the programme administrator as mentor, coach, and instructional leader. It also covers other important business issues within the administrator's responsibilities, such as financial planning and budgeting, management, using social media effectively, program evaluation, facility planning and management, and working with families.

ECP4013 FINAL YEAR PROJECT 1

Prerequisite: None

Students will be guided in acquiring skills required for undertaking academic research studies in this course. They will choose a research topic and the study will be completed

within a semester long period. At the end of the course they will produce a research report (project paper) which to be evaluated as the course assessment.

ECP4015 PRACTICUM (TASKA)**Prerequisite: PASSED at least 75% of ALL COURSE**

This course provides students with real teaching experience at both nursery (TASKA) and kindergarten (TADIKA). At nursery school, students are given with the opportunities to use skills and knowledge in providing teaching and routine activities for children less than 3 years old. They are also required to focus on curriculum development in the nursery. Furthermore, students will be exposed to planning children's development to enable effective planning and assessment for the development of children.

ECP4023 FINAL YEAR PROJECT 2**Prerequisite: None**

Students will be guided in acquiring skills required for undertaking academic research studies in this course. They will choose a research topic and the study will be completed within a semester long period. At the end of the course they will produce a research report (project paper) which to be evaluated as the course assessment.

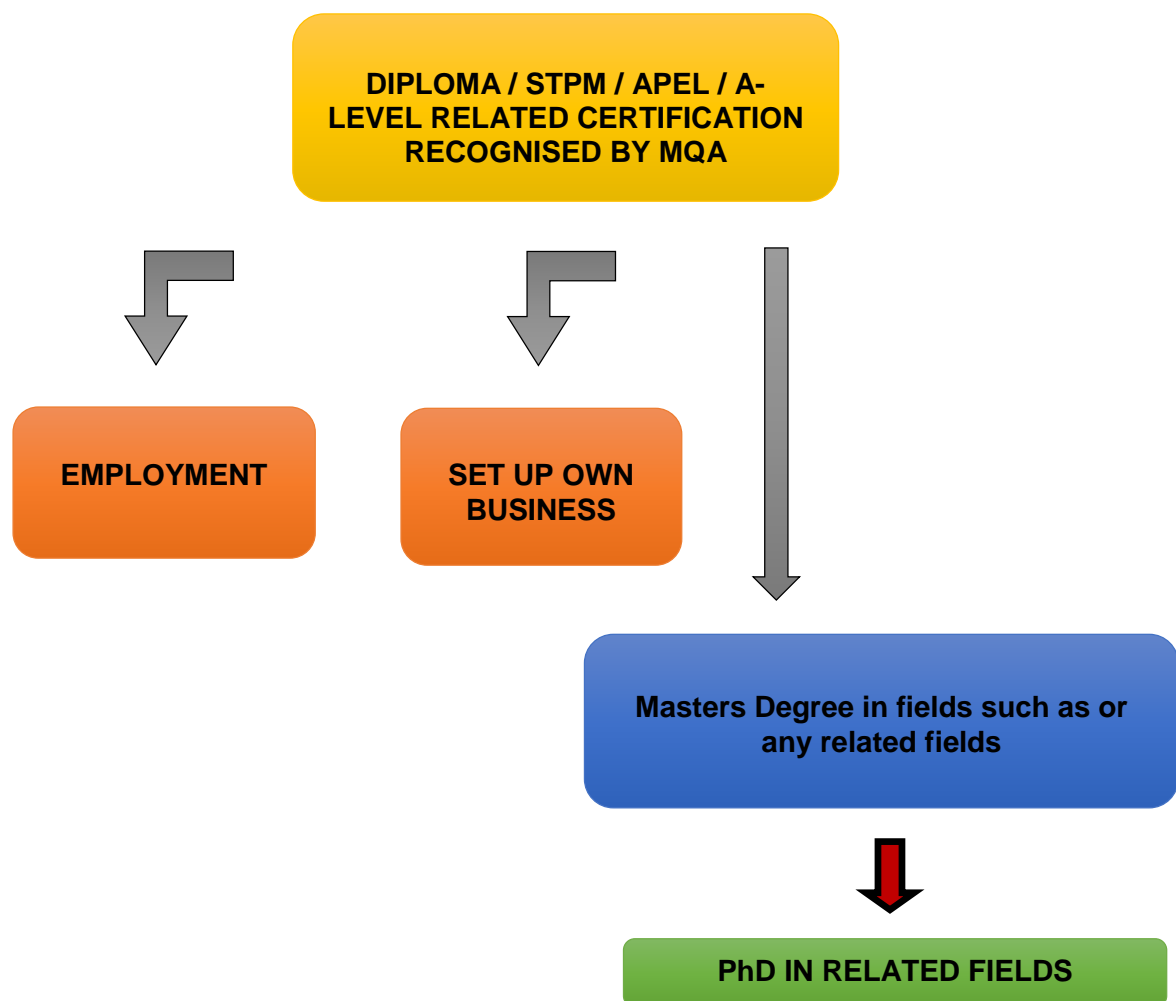
ECP4025 PRACTICUM 2 (TADIKA)**Prerequisite: PASSED ALL COURSES**

This course provides students with real teaching experience at both nursery (TASKA) and kindergarten (TADIKA). At kindergarten school, students gets the opportunities to apply skills and knowledge to teaching and routine activities in the kindergarten for children aged 4 to 6. They are expected to focus on the development of curriculum used in the kindergarten where they will be exposed to curriculum planning for children to ensure that the planning assessment of children's development is effectively conducted.
